The Brother HL-L2460DW is an ideal printer for those who don't need a daily printing solution but require occasional scanning. It's reliable, affordable, and easy to use, making it perfect for individuals or families with limited printing needs. This model offers excellent value for its price, matching the paper capacity of our color laser pick at a fraction of the cost. The 250-sheet tray is spacious enough to handle regular printing demands. Additionally, it features automatic duplex printing, reliable Wi-Fi connectivity, and the option to use high-yield toner cartridges, making it a budget-friendly option. In terms of print quality, the HL-L2460DW excels for text-based documents but may require some settings tweaks for graphics-heavy prints. Its compact design makes it suitable for tight spaces, such as bookcase shelves. However, there are some minor drawbacks to consider. The printer can be slightly flimsy, and the packaging is not ideal. Brother's software is also mediocre, and users may experience issues with Google Cloud Print compatibility. Furthermore, this printer only prints in black and white, lacks copying and scanning capabilities, and has limited features compared to other models. Costs are reasonable at \$0.032 per page for black-and-white pages and \$0.128 for color, with the option to join HP's Instant Ink program for set-and-forget refills and cheaper color printing. The printer's sleek design also sets it apart from stodgy-looking competitors. The 9125e is plenty fast for just about anyone who plans to use it in a home or home-office setting, printing at up to 22 pages per minute for black-and-white documents and 18 ppm for color. We also like the bright, capacitive touchscreen display, which makes it easy to navigate menus compared to single-line, monochrome, non-touch displays found on other printers. The HP Smart desktop and mobile app make it easy to scan to or print from all devices. Flaws but not dealbreakers include the potential for coercive tactics during setup, a single 250-sheet paper tray that may be less than what some people want, and touchscreen buttons that can be difficult to hit due to their small size. You don't get much toner in the box, like most laser printers. The HP Envy 3301fdw comes with "starter" toner cartridges that are only good for 600 black-and-white and 500 color pages. You'll need to replace them soon, which will cost around \$450. Be prepared to shell out for replacement toner within the first year or so. This model is big and heavy, weighing more than twice as much as our budget laser pick (the Brother HL-L2460DW), taking up significant space on a desk, and probably won't fit on a bookshelf due to its nearly 19-inch depth. The Epson SureColor P700 consistently delivers excellent-quality prints with long-lasting pigment inks. It also offers a color touchscreen and other appealing features. The premature need to replace the ink, however, is not so user-friendly. This printer is for serious photographers or those who aspire to be. It's capable of delivering gallery-quality prints up to 13 inches wide and can print panoramas up to 10 feet long. You can also print on a huge variety of media, including metal and CDs. You can use the rear paper feed for papers up to 0.5 mm thick. Load thicker media (up to 1.5 mm) through the front feeder. The touchscreen interface is a cut above what you can get from most rivals. Ink costs are reasonable, and you can buy extra-large-capacity tanks, so you'll need to fill up less often. The P700's UltraChrome HD pigment ink is one of the longest-lasting consumer-level inks. It has USB, Ethernet, and Wi-Fi connections for faster printing. You'll know the printer is almost done with its job when it starts flashing the "low ink" warning much sooner than usual. Dimensions for this model are 20.3 x 14.5 x 17.3 inches, while weighing in at 35.3 pounds. The cost of replacement ink is a steep \$1.52 per milliliter.
